Many generous individuals along with local and regional businesses helped us through the 2017-18 school year in serving the needs of extreme poverty and homeless teens throughout Siskiyou, Shasta and Tehama counties. Along with ongoing requests for specific student needs sent to us by High School counselors, principals and administration staff, we regularly receive notes from them affirming the impact that the purchase and supply of clothing items, personal hygiene supplies, bus passes and multiple other necessities are having on the hope, resilience and outlook of the students who receive them.



In one of our meetings with the principals from Shasta County High Schools we considered the growing needs of the students which had been multiplied as a result of the devastating fires last summer. The principals from Shasta, Enterprise and Foothill High School suggested collaborating on an annual 5k-10k fundraising run to help create the revenue we need to sustain current resource levels and enlarge the Solutions for Youth program.

We are excited to present this opportunity and ask you to join us by sponsoring at any one of 5 levels for our May 11^{th,} 2019, "Bright Future Fun Run." This will be a USATF Certified run, so it will draw runners from a large region of northern California. With the engagement of High School ASB groups, student athletes, parents and staff, we anticipate this being a significant community event and a great way to fund the needs of homeless and extreme poverty youth through the 2019-2020 school year.

The issue of adult homelessness is in the local news almost every day, and other agencies and groups are trying to figure out those complex problems. What your partnership with Solutions for Youth addresses is the future of our community. We found that 35% of the adults who are currently homeless had experienced homelessness as children. The teens we serve are couch-surfing, living with unrelated adults in local motels or low-income housing, in a car or out in the elements, or living with family members in extreme poverty where they are in daily risk of losing their current arrangements for shelter and safety. Remarkably, these students are actively enrolled in High School, wearing the same clothes for days at a time and often excluded from participating in academic, athletic and social opportunities enjoyed by their peers. These kids are heroes to us, and we are committed to ease the stresses they face by suppling tangible resources, giving them the hope and encouragement they need to not give up.

Solutions for Youth Fund – Program goals:

To supply the essential day to day needs of homeless students and those at risk of homelessness who are currently enrolled in area High Schools. Too often these students stand out for the wrong reasons (wearing the same clothes every day... unable to participate in the things that other students are doing in athletic, social and academic activities). Additionally, these students face the internal factors of discouragement stemming from not having a place to shower or the pressure of unseemly expectations from those who have offered them a place to stay. Our goal is that through the tangible supply of hygiene items, a prom dress, a winter coat, packages of underwear or paying for a membership at a local gym where they can shower, we can offer them hope and the knowledge that they are not alone as they face these external and internal challenges. We are currently working to supply these needs in concert with 9 High Schools in northern California from Red Bluff to Yreka.

Program Process:

The Solutions for Youth Fund (SYF) was organized and initially funded by Children First Foster Family Agency. We coordinate with High School administration and guidance counselors who identify students, vet their needs for clothing, bus passes, or fees for involvement in extracurricular sports or academic programs. They relay specific requests to SYF administration, we shop for the items and deliver them to the school; keeping the student's identity confidential.

This Fundraiser:

The 5K-10K run was the idea of Principals from **Shasta High School, Foothill High School and Enterprise High School.** They are participating in the planning of this event, mobilizing their ASB groups and recruiting parents and students across all three campuses to support and participate in this fundraiser.
