#### Be The Change You Want To See: Join Our ITFC Treatment Team!

In today's society there are so many environmental factors that cause a tremendous amount of pressure to families, and especially to the children. When families fail to meet the needs of the children - either emotionally, mentally, or physically - who will be there to help them?

**WILL IT BE YOU?** There has never been a greater time than right now for these children to have a stable and safe family environment with parents that understand trauma and will support them through their healing process.

Children First's Intensive Treatment Foster Care (ITFC) program has provided services to Tehama, Shasta and Siskiyou Counties since 2009. An ITFC home is an *alternative* to group-based residential treatment or psychiatric hospitalization for children 5-18 years of age who require services greater than general foster care. Eligible children have the following challenges: multiple placements, serious emotional/behavioral issues, possible group home placements or are being stepped-down from a group home environment.

How can you get involved? Do you know an individual who is experienced in working with abused/neglected children? Do you know someone who is eager to learn and develop new skills on an ongoing basis? Is there someone that you know who is resilient and will view themselves as members of our "treatment team" and someone who will understand the value of parenting-flexibility to best serve each child? Perhaps that someone is you.

Our program reduces exposure to a group home environment with similar challenges by taking children out of the institutional setting and placing them in a supportive home environment. When getting to the root of the problem, these children need someone they can trust, someone who will help them heal from their pain.

Every ITFC family is provided with an in home specialist and a support counselor who, through experience, are quick to establish a relationship with the child and are highly skilled at working with our foster parents. Our ITFC foster parents receive 60 hours of training that prepares them for working with higher level children. The program will also provide the framework for safety, limits, boundaries, consistency and predictability for individualized treatment.

The primary-change-agents in the child's life are the "substitute parents" who are providing constant and consistent care in a family environment in which the child is a valued member.

Be the caring adult who not only serves on the front lines of behavioral change but also as the role model who provides the care and love needed to healthy development and a sense-of-belonging.

In 2008 "Children First" opened its Siskiyou office in Yreka, California. Our Siskiyou office has been serving the entire North State with a variety of services ranging from general foster family placements to Intensive Treatment Foster Care.

Our Siskiyou office visitation provided а for Siskiyou program County families who were in reunification for over seven years. We still provide family visits for individuals with services that were either recommended mandated by the family law court mediator and we still assist the county when they have a specific visitation need.

Children First has over 30 homes in Siskiyou County. Our mission is to support these families through their fostering journey and we are proud to say that we have a retention rate of over 96%.

We have a team of women who are dedicated to making the agency in Siskiyou to be efficient and therapeutic for our foster families and for the children.

## **Creating Leaders of Tomorrow!!**

If you have ever fostered or cared for a child who is nearing the age of eighteen you will know that this is an important milestone in their life. This is the time where responsibility and commitment will play a key role in their success as a young adult. What every parent wants for their children is to see them become strong, mature adults who are a respected member of their community.

Each year in California, over 4000 young adults exit the foster care system when they turn 18. These "emancipated foster youth" commonly leave the foster care system without a place to live, a job, a high school diploma or the consistent support of a caring adult.

Our Transitional Housing Plus Foster Care (THP+FC) works with youth between the ages of 18-21 and our Transitional Housing Program Plus (THP-Plus) works with youth who are between the ages of 21 and 24. These programs were designed to help in the preparation and responsibilities of adulthood, and we have had some pretty good success stories over the years.

The THP+FC Program provides up to three years of rent and utility payment assistance along with a monthly grocery allowance. Our social workers will help guide these young adults and will teach them skills such as budgeting, job attainment and career search and training. Our participants are required to work or be enrolled in school.

Along with guiding them into the world as we know it after foster care ends, there has to be a way to show these young adults that they can be successful in whatever they choose to do. The agency does this by educating our participants,

touring colleges, businesses, and allowing them to have the opportunity to listen to other "stories of success".

Do you want to know how you can get involved and help?
